

WHERE IS THE FESTIVAL?

The Oceans Calling Festival will be held on the beach near the Ocean City Inlet, located at 809 South Atlantic Ave, Ocean City, MD 21842. The festival grounds will include the south end of the Boardwalk (Atlantic Ave) and Boardwalk businesses. Therefore, they will not be open to the general public during the festival weekend.



Entrance locations will be at each of the following streets:

- N. Division St.
- North Beach (directly across from N Division St).
- Caroline St. *for Ultimate, Platinum, and VIP guests only
- Talbot St.
- Somerset St.
- Wicomico St.
- Worcester St.
- S. Division St.

GETTING TO THE FESTIVAL & PARKING

FESTIVAL GOERS

- Parking: West OC Park & Ride,
 Convention Center, or 100th St.
 Municipal Lot.
- Transit: Beach Bus (\$4 ride-all-day, 6 a.m.-2 a.m., express service) or West
 OC Shuttle from Park & Ride.
- Bus fare is free for kids under 42" & ADA
- Walking/Biking/Scooting: We encourage walking, biking, or riding your scooter! You'll find bike racks at 1st-2nd St. (be sure to bring a lock). If you're walking from 27th St., it takes about 40 minutes to reach the entrance. Note: Class 2 & 3 e-bikes are not allowed on the Boardwalk.

RESIDENTS & BUSINESSES

- Parking Restrictions: No street parking on ocean blocks south of N. Division St. Sept 23- Oct 10. Vehicles in violation will be towed to the Ocean City Police Department.
- Access: Deliveries and employees allowed through secure checkpoints.
 Private lots remain accessible.

ACCESSIBILITY

- ADA Parking: Available at all municipal lots.
- Drop-off/Pick-up: 101 Worcester St.
- **Transit:** All municipal buses are ADA accessible.


- After 8 p.m., vehicles can't access areas south of N. Division St.

TRAFFIC & ROAD CLOSURES

ALL TRAFFIC PATTERNS AND CLOSURES ARE SCHEDULED TO OCCUR AT 8 P.M. EACH OF THE FESTIVAL DAYS

TRAFFIC & ROAD CHANGES

- St. Louis Ave (southbound): Restricted to emergency vehicles, residents, and employees of downtown businesses.
 - Southbound traffic on St. Louis Ave will be directed to 2nd Street → Philadelphia Ave.
- US Rt. 50 → Philadelphia Ave (south turn lane): Restricted to emergency, mass transit, and residents only.
 - o Traffic will be diverted onto N. Division St. → northbound Baltimore Ave.
- Baltimore Ave:
 - Left lane open to vehicles
 - Middle lane buses only
 - Right lane safety access only





Tip: Expect delays when leaving the festival. Enjoy the Boardwalk or support local downtown businesses while traffic clears.

PARKING RESTRICTIONS

- Starting Tuesday, Sept. 23, 2025: No Parking on the ocean blocks of Caroline, Talbot, Wicomico, and S. Division Streets.
 - Vehicles parked here will be towed to OCPD (6501 Coastal Hwy).
 - Private driveways and private lots remain accessible for residents and employees.

MUNICIPAL PARKING CLOSURES

- N. Division Street Lot closed to the public from Sept. 16 Oct. 11, 2025 (festival loading zone).
- Whiteside Lot will be closed to the public from Sept. 17 to Oct. 10, 2025.
- 4th Street Municipal Lot will be the Rideshare drop-off/pick-up for the festival weekend.

EVENT TIMELINE

SEPTEMBER 15, 2025

The Inlet Parking Lot will be closed to the public beginning Wednesday, September 15, through Sunday, October 12, 2025

There are some evening hours during the October Cruisin' event

SEPTEMBER 16. 2025

The municipal parking at N. Division Street will be closed to the public. This will serve as an active "construction" crossing point until Saturday, October 11th.

The Beach at N. Division Street/Caroline Street and east of the Inlet Parking Lot will be closed to the public.

SEPTEMBER 18, 2025

All of the beach areas south of N. Division Street will be closed to the public.

Note: Fencing along the Boardwalk will go up with a gate during the time leading up to the event. The gates will remain open until Thursday's closure.

SEPTEMBER 25. 2025

The Boardwalk from N.
Division Street South is anticipated to be closed to the public around 10:30 p.m.

SEPTEMBER 26-28, 2025

The festival hours are from 12 p.m. - 11 p.m. daily.

SEPTEMBER 29, 2025

The Boardwalk will be reopened to the public by 6 a.m.

THE BEACH REOPENING

The Beach will open in stages as areas are cleaned and deemed safe for public use on or before October 9, 2025.

Ocean City Inlet Beach between 1st St and 2nd St, across from the Plim Plaza Hotel.

OUR TOP FAQ'S

CAN I ACCESS THE BOARDWALK IF I AM NOT ATTENDING THE FESTIVAL?

The Boardwalk (Atlantic Ave) from 27th Street to North Division Street will be open to the public. The south end of the Boardwalk, as well as the Boardwalk businesses in that area, will be included in the festival grounds. Therefore, the Boardwalk south of North Division Street will not be open to the general public during the festival weekend.

WILL THERE BE TRAFFIC?

We anticipate a steady flow of vehicle and pedestrian traffic throughout the day. The majority of the traffic congestion is anticipated after the festival. We will establish an alternate traffic pattern to accommodate additional pedestrian walkways and the staging of multiple Beach Buses along Baltimore Avenue for those wishing to take the bus back. To avoid the congestion, take a stroll along the Ocean City Boardwalk or visit a downtown business outside of the festival footprint.

WHERE CAN I PARK?

Parking in the downtown area will be extremely limited during the festival weekend. Public transportation, walking/biking, and ride sharing are encouraged.

WILL THERE BE HANDICAPPED PARKING?

101 Worcester Street (Worcester Street Municipal Lot) has been designated as a drop-off and pick-up for any disabled individual(s). All open and/or available municipal parking lots have ADA parking spaces. Additionally, our Beach Buses are ADA-compliant.

IF I LIVE AND/OR WORK DOWNTOWN, HOW DO I GET TO MY JOB OR RESIDENCE AFTER THE TRAFFIC PATTERN STARTS?

If you work or reside within the festival grounds area and need to get downtown after 8:00 p.m., please head to St. Louis Ave at 2nd Street. Ocean City Police personnel will be present at this intersection to direct traffic. Mass transit, emergency vehicles, downtown residents, and business patrons will be allowed to travel south of this location. Everyone else traveling southbound will be rerouted toward Philadelphia Ave from St. Louis Ave and 2nd Street.

BUSINESSES FAQ

CAN I STILL RECEIVE DELIVERIES DURING THE FESTIVAL?

Yes, you can still receive deliveries. We suggest that you contact your scheduled delivery companies to inform them that additional time will be required to access the festival area.

HOW DO MY EMPLOYEES GET TO WORK IF OUR BUSINESS IS ON THE FESTIVAL GROUNDS?

If your business is within the festival grounds, please remind employees to factor in additional time to get to work. Employees will not be able to access your business through backdoors. To ensure the safety of employees and participants, everyone must pass through a secure checkpoint. Credentialed employees should use the closest entrance to your business to minimize having to fight through the festival crowd

WHERE DO MY EMPLOYEES PARK?

Employees will be able to utilize your designated/private parking lots. If employees typically park within the ocean block (10 blocks), they will need to find the next available parking area. Street parking within the ocean block (10 blocks) from N. Division South will be prohibited.

HOW WILL PATRONS AND EMPLOYEES GET TO MY ESTABLISHMENT IF WE ARE NOT INCLUDED IN THE FESTIVAL GROUNDS?

Boardwalk businesses operating outside of the festival footprint may continue to operate as usual. Parking downtown will be limited throughout the weekend, so employees should plan accordingly.

WILL THE TRAFFIC PATTERNS AFFECT MY COMMUTE TO WORK?

The traffic pattern will take effect at 8 p.m. and remain in place until the conclusion of the festival. We do anticipate a steady flow of vehicle and pedestrian traffic throughout the day. We suggest leaving early, having a parking plan, and staying alert for vehicles, pedestrians, and bicyclists traveling the roadways in the Town of Ocean City.





PUBLIC SAFETY FAQ

IS IT SAFE TO VISIT OCEAN CITY DURING SUCH A LARGE EVENT?

Ocean City is a great destination for families, and it's safe to visit Ocean City and the Boardwalk. The Town of Ocean City has been diligently planning for the Oceans Calling Festival to ensure the event is safe and enjoyable for the participants, businesses, and residents. Residents and Visitors can expect the same level of enforcement and presence of law enforcement personnel they are accustomed to.

WILL THERE BE ENOUGH POLICE OFFICERS TO HANDLE THE EVENT?

The Ocean City Police Department is fully committed to ensuring the safety and security of the Oceans Calling Festival. We are prepared to assist with the festival, and several seasonal personnel are still employed with our agency. A security company will be stationed within the venue, allowing our officers to remain available for emergency calls. We will also have a full complement of law enforcement personnel in the downtown area to assist with traffic congestion and pedestrian crossings.

WILL THERE BE ISSUES WITH TRAFFIC BACK-UPS?

Traffic congestion is expected to be minimal throughout the day. The festival takes place from 12 p.m. to 11 p.m. each day. We anticipate that festivalgoers will arrive throughout the day. The majority of the traffic congestion is anticipated after the festival. We will establish an alternate traffic pattern to accommodate additional pedestrian walkways and the staging of multiple Beach Buses along Baltimore Avenue for those wishing to take the bus back.

To avoid the congestion, take a stroll along the Ocean City Boardwalk or visit a downtown business outside of the festival footprint.

ARE THERE SAFETY MEASURES IN PLACE AT THE FESTIVAL?

Safety is our first priority. The Town of Ocean City has worked closely with event organizers to ensure the safest possible experience for residents and visitors. For the safety of everyone entering the festival, all attendees are subject to a thorough and comprehensive security search prior to entry. While inside the festival, remember: You're the eyes and ears of the festival. If you see something suspicious, say something.

Looking Out for Each Other at Oceans Calling

- Watch out for your neighbors: If someone looks like they need help, check in—or let a staff member know if things get unruly.
- Be considerate: This is a shared space. Keep the vibes positive and respect those around you.
- Use the buddy system: If you get separated, meet at the Main Guest Services Tent. Staff are always ready to help.
- Stay aware: Keep an eye on your surroundings and your belongings.

TRANSPORTATION FAQ

WILL THE BEACH BUS BE RUNNING ITS NORMAL SCHEDULE?

No. The Beach Bus will operate in a reduced-stop, express service during the festival weekend.

- Southbound: 144th St (North Transit Station), 142nd, 139th, 137th, 131st, 130th, 126th, 123rd, 121st, 118th, 115th, 107th, 100th / Old Landing Rd, 99th, 94th, 85th, 82nd, 78th, 71st, 69th, 67th, 65th, 61st, 56th, 49th, 45th, 43rd, 41st, 37th, 32nd, 30th, 27th, 26th, 21st, 17th, 14th, 8th, and 3rd.
- Northbound: Talbot (i.e. festival entrance), 8th, 13th, 18th, 21st, 26th, 32nd, 39th, 46th, 48th, 54th, 59th, 67th, 74th, 80th, 86th, 92nd, 100th / Old Landing Rd, 107th, 115th, 123rd, 130th, 135th, 139th, 144th(North Transit Station).
- Some stops will be **inactive and covered.** Please walk to the nearest active stop.
- f Altogether, that makes 63 active stops on the Oceans Calling express Beach Bus route

Leaving the festival: Catch the *northbound* Beach Bus on Baltimore Ave. between Wicomico St. and Talbot St.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST TO RIDE THE BEACH BUS?

- Standard Fare: \$4 Ride-All-Day
- Half Fare (\$2): Seniors (65+), Disabled Persons, Medicare card holders, and Non-Resident Senior Bus Pass holders
- Free: Children under 42", ADA Certified Disabled card holders, and OC Resident Senior Bus Pass holders
- Exact cash or a prepaid photo ID General Bus Pass (from City Hall) is required. Proof of eligibility may be requested.

WHAT ABOUT THE WEST OCEAN CITY PARK & RIDE SHUTTLE?

- Operated by an outside provider.
- Tickets are sold at OC Transportation ticket booths (Bus Terminal buildings).
- Tickets must be presented when boarding.

Festival pick-up location (after concerts): South Terminal Bus Station (South Division St.).

TRANSPORTATION FAQ

WHERE CAN I BE DROPPED OFF IF I USE A RIDESHARE OR TAXI?

- Official location: 409 Baltimore Ave. (4th St. Municipal Lot)
- Walking distance: ~5–10 minutes to the festival grounds.
- Expect high demand after concerts. Consider leaving a little early or enjoying the boardwalk while the rush clears.

ARE THERE OTHER TRANSIT OPTIONS?

- OC Bay Hopper Water Taxi: Hop-on at 118th St. Kiosk, Ocean Pines Yacht Club, OC Convention Center, and West Ocean City. Tickets online.
- Hotel Shuttles: Some hotels may offer courtesy shuttles (drop-off at Somerset St., two blocks from the venue). Check with your hotel.

CAN I WALK, BIKE, OR RIDE MY SCOOTER TO THE FESTIVAL?

Yes, it is highly encouraged.

- Walking times (to Main Entrance):
 - o 40th St: ~55 min
 - o 30th St: ~45 min
 - o 20th St: ~30 min
 - o 10th St: ~15 min
- From West OC Park & Ride: ~20 min walk / 8 min bike
- Bike/Scooter parking: Available off the boardwalk between 2nd & 3rd St. Don't forget to bring your own lock.
- Rentals: Bike World, Dandy Don's, Big Jim's Bikes, Cycle City

IS TRANSPORTATION ADA-ACCESSIBLE?

Yes. Full ADA parking and entry information is available in the ADA Getting Here Guide.

Festival Tip: Plan ahead! Whether you bus, bike, walk, or take a rideshare, give yourself extra travel time, especially when concerts end.

BOARDWALK FAQ

WILL THE BOARDWALK BE OPEN TO NON-FESTIVAL GOERS?

Yes. The Boardwalk (Atlantic Ave.) from 27th Street to North Division Street will remain open to the public during the festival weekend.

• South of North Division Street: Within the festival footprint and open only to festivalgoers during festival hours (12 p.m.-11:30 p.m., Sept. 26-28, 2025).

CAN I USE MY FESTIVAL WRISTBAND AT BOARDWALK BUSINESSES?

No. Boardwalk businesses operate independently and accept their own forms of payment. Festival wristbands are only valid for purchases made at festival vendors.

CAN I RIDE MY BICYCLE ON THE BOARDWALK?

Yes! Bicycles are allowed at all times on the Boardwalk. Riding is a great way to avoid traffic.

- Bike parking: Between 1st & 2nd Streets on the beach (bring your own lock).
- Note: Class 2 & 3 e-bikes are not permitted on the Boardwalk.
- Bicycles are not allowed inside the festival grounds.

ARE DOGS ALLOWED ON THE BOARDWALK?

Not yet. Dogs are not permitted on the Boardwalk or beach until after October 1. Service animals are always welcome.

CAN I HAVE ALCOHOL ON THE BOARDWALK?

No. Open containers and alcohol consumption are prohibited by town ordinance outside festival grounds.

- Alcohol may be purchased and consumed within the festival grounds only (some restrictions apply).
- Please drink responsibly and plan a safe ride home.

CAN WE STAY ON THE BEACH AFTER THE FESTIVAL ENDS?

Festival grounds (including businesses within them) will close at 11:30 p.m. each night.

- The beach itself closes at midnight for cleaning.
- Sleeping on the beach is prohibited.
- If you're not ready to head home, enjoy the Boardwalk and nearby businesses outside the festival footprint.
- **Festival Tip:** The Boardwalk is for everyone. Let's keep it clean, safe, and welcoming all weekend long!

FESTIVAL GOERS FAQ

WHAT IS THE BAG POLICY AT OCEANS CALLING?

- ALL bags will be searched before entry.
- Small clutch purses and fanny packs that are 6" x 9" or smaller do not need to be clear, but can have no more than one pocket.
- All other bags larger than 6" x 9" must be smaller than 12" x 6" x 12" and clear.
- Hydration packs are allowed and do not need to be clear, but must be emptied of all liquid and have no more than two pockets in addition to the one holding the water reservoir.



*SUBJECT TO CHANGE

WHAT ITEMS ARE ALLOWED INSIDE THE FESTIVAL?

All guests and belongings are subject to search.

- Help speed up entry by leaving large bags at home.

ARE LOCKERS AVAILABLE FOR RENT?

Yes! Lockers are available and can be reserved in advance of the festival. <u>Click here to reserve</u> <u>yours.</u>

CAN I LEAVE AND RE-ENTER ON THE SAME DAY?

Yes. Festivalgoers may leave and re-enter freely until 7 PM each day.

• Each re-entry requires scanning your wristband and passing through security.

WHAT IF MY WRISTBAND IS LOST, DAMAGED, OR TOO TIGHT?

Replacement is available, but it is subject to verification.

- Please bring your wristband (if applicable), your order confirmation, and a valid governmentissued ID to the Box Office.
- A \$20 replacement fee will apply.
